

# Editor Paul Coyne

## Biography

Award-winning editor Paul J. Coyne recently co-produced and edited the feature film, “The Mostly Unfabulous Social Life of Ethan Green,” which premiered at the 2005 Tribeca Film Festival.

The recipient of an Emmy nomination for his work on “Survivor All-Stars,” he has edited such reality shows as “The Amazing Race,” “The Bachelor,” and “Average Joe.” Coyne has also served as a producer on the CBS primetime hit, “Big Brother,” and the cult series, “The Joe Schmo Show.” He also served as the Supervising Producer of William Shatner's “Invasion Iowa.”

Among Coyne’s other notable career achievements, he co-produced and edited Barbra Streisand's award-winning “The Living Century” series for PBS, and edited “Dolphins: Minds in the Water” (winner of the CINE Golden Eagle Award, among other honors).

“Raising Flagg” mirrored Coyne’s own small-town upbringing and the colorful characters of his youth. Still tied to his own hometown, he annually awards five creative arts scholarships at his former high school, as well as a scholarship for women filmmakers at his alma mater, Fitchburg State College in Massachusetts. Fitchburg recently honored him with a Distinguished Alumnus Award at its 2005 commencement ceremonies.

Coyne recently completed post-production on a new investigative documentary, “Have You Seen Andy?”, which he produced about a 1976 unsolved childhood disappearance.
